Appeal denied because one complainant confirmed the evidence of the other complainant and it was a specific charge, despite inconsistency in the evidence each complainant gave and despite the unreliability of each complainant individually. Also, because of the excellent summing up by the judge, the jury could not have failed to understand the level of proof required on each count. Therefore there were no grounds on which the judges could interfere with the jury's verdict)
